From the Pastor's desk

Advent Confessions

For the last many years, the practice is to attend the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Advent and again during Lent. In my younger years this was not the practice. People went to confession very often, regardless of what season of the year it was. After all, we don't just sin during Advent and Lent. I am grateful to those many parishioners who visit me in the confessional on a regular basis, either in the confessional on Saturday from 3 pm to 3:45 pm or in my office prior or after Mass. Confession is a thermometer of one's spiritual life. Be that as it may, it has been over two years since we have had a communal penance liturgy with individual confessions, due to Covid. This coming Tuesday, 13 December we will have a penance liturgy and confessions here at St. Anthony's Parish. Several priests will be here to assist me hear your confessions. I encourage everyone to attend, but especially the communion ministers and altar servers: those handling the sacred vessels. Keep your confessions brief at this time. Confess any mortal or serious sins first, then the venial sins. If you need to tell a lengthier account of your sins and receive spiritual direction, then it may be best to make an appointment with a priest at a separate time.

Mass stipends

Sometimes people ask about Mass stipends. Where do all the Mass stipends go? Does the priest get to keep all the money from Mass intentions? The answer to that question is "no", the priest does not keep all the Mass stipends. By Canon Law (Church law), the priest is allowed to receive the stipend (money) from only one Mass intention/day. The remainder is sent to the chancery office and from there the Mass intentions are sent to parishes which do not have any Mass intentions. For instance, when I was stationed in a rural parish, there were rarely any Mass intentions requested. I had to ask the chancery office and they would send me Mass intentions. Each year we, as a parish send hundreds of Mass intentions to the chancery office for redistribution. In other words, Father is not getting rich on Mass intentions!
