From the Pastor's desk:

Sanctuary Floor

Flooring is not what everyone looks at, however for those who do, you will have certainly noticed that our sanctuary floor is now complete. Some people have asked me about the circles; one before the altar and the other before the tabernacle. These depict a rose which is the "queen of all flowers" because it is the most perfect of all flowers. In the Book of Solomon 2:1 we read "I am the rose of Sharon and the lily of the valleys." Although the writer was not referring to Jesus, we can only surmise that Jesus is symbolically referred to as the rose of Sharon. After all, Jesus is totally perfect in His nature and personality, and like the rose can be found all over the world. The circles represent a compass. In other words, no matter which direction one comes from, all directions lead toward Jesus. These two circles are a gift from the granite stairs installer Joe Bruni at Granite by Design. The ceramic tiles were installed by the same man who laid the flooring in the office area and the rectory, Victorio Loconte. I want to thank the many parishioners who assisted in moving the furniture and statues in the sanctuary, those who tore out the old carpet, Marcel Danis who did all the electrical work, and of course Tony DiNella who oversaw the entire project. Odie Intertas used his own vacuum and spent several hours vacuuming the sanctuary after the old carpet was taken out, prior going to his own work. May God bless each of you. It is our plan to remove the carpet in the main body of the church during the summer. All of the pews will have to be moved and we don't want to be doing that now during the winter. Plus, I need time to recover from all the dust from the sanctuary project!!!

Blessing of our new sanctuary will take place when Archbishop Richard Gagnon comes here to confirm the candidates for the sacrament of confirmation on Thursday May 10.

Pin a Pair – the donated items are given to Chez Nous who distribute the items to the poor. We are accepting new or gently used hats, mitts, scarves,


socks and (new) underwear. No other clothes please. The CWL executive meeting will be held on Feb. 27 at 7:30pm and the General meeting on March 1st


