From the Pastor's desk

Freemasonry & Catholicism

As recently as November 13, 2023 the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith at the Vatican issued another clarification regarding membership and involvement in the Freemasons. Membership in Freemasonry is very significant in the Philippines; it involves not only those who are formally enrolled in Masonic Lodges but also a large number of sympathizers and associates who are convinced that there is no opposition between membership in the Catholic Church and in Masonic Lodges. Active membership in Freemasonry by a Catholic is forbidden because of the irreconcilability between Catholic doctrine and Freemasonry. Those Catholics who are involved, in any way with Freemasonry, are in a state of mortal sin and may not receive Holy Communion. All ties with Freemasonry must be broken and the person must first visit the Sacrament of Reconciliation prior to approaching the sacred altar for Holy Communion. This subject was just recently discussed at the Council of Priests' meeting here in Winnipeg.

Father Anthony Griffin from Opus Dei will be here at St. Anthony's Parish on Monday & Tuesday, February 19 & 20. He will be giving spiritual direction, hearing confessions and offering a presentation to women, men and priests. Times will be posted as we near the aforementioned dates.

Finance & Parish Councils will meet this coming Tuesday, 13 February at 7 pm in the gathering area. If a member is unable to attend, please notify the parish office.

We continue to pray to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. We also continue to pray for the vocations which the Lord has given to us; namely Fr. The Discernment Group consists of approximately twelve young men who meet every month. The young men may not all advance to become priests, but it is certainly our hope and prayer that some will. The primary goal of the group is to build their relationship with God, the Church and one another, so that, no matter what vocation they may choose, they may be more rooted in their Catholic faith. We begin our time together with Eucharistic Adoration, followed by pizza. We then have a talk on a particular subject like: prayer, stewardship, confession, purity or other relevant topics. Sometimes we have a guest, such as another priest or lay person who speaks on a given subject. Other times we watch a video, followed by a discussion. We end the evening in the church with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. We also attend events in the Archdiocese such as Pro-life suppers, Chrism Mass, ordinations or the annual Serra supper. Recently we sponsored four of the members when they attended at Come & See weekend at St. Joseph's Seminary in Edmonton. This gave them the opportunity to be with the seminarians and experience life in the seminary first hand. Once we made a road trip to Saskatoon where we visited and had supper with the Ukrainian Sisters of St. Joseph, toured their building, packed with Nativity scenes, their icon shop and beautiful, ornate chapel dedicated to their two martyrs, Sister Olympia and Laurentia. This gave us the opportunity to venerate their relics. We stayed overnight at the Benedictine Monastery in Munster, SK. There are many who pray and sacrifice for these young men, in particular those who attend Eucharistic adoration in the Adoration Chapel. We are grateful for their intercessory prayers, as well as any others who may be praying for vocations to the priesthood and to the religious life.
