The Discernment Group consists of approximately twelve young men who meet every month. The young men may not all advance to become priests, but it is certainly our hope and prayer that some will. The primary goal of the group is to build their relationship with God, the Church and one another, so that, no matter what vocation they may choose, they may be more rooted in their Catholic faith. We begin our time together with Eucharistic Adoration, followed by pizza. We then have a talk on a particular subject like: prayer, stewardship, confession, purity or other relevant topics. Sometimes we have a guest, such as another priest or lay person who speaks on a given subject. Other times we watch a video, followed by a discussion. We end the evening in the church with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. We also attend events in the Archdiocese such as Pro-life suppers, Chrism Mass, ordinations or the annual Serra supper. Recently we sponsored four of the members when they attended at Come & See weekend at St. Joseph's Seminary in Edmonton. This gave them the opportunity to be with the seminarians and experience life in the seminary first hand. Once we made a road trip to Saskatoon where we visited and had supper with the Ukrainian Sisters of St. Joseph, toured their building, packed with Nativity scenes, their icon shop and beautiful, ornate chapel dedicated to their two martyrs. Sister Olympia and Laurentia. This gave us the opportunity to venerate their relics. We stayed overnight at the Benedictine Monastery in Munster, SK. There are many who pray and sacrifice for these young men, in particular those who attend Eucharistic adoration in the Adoration Chapel. We are grateful for their intercessory prayers, as well as any others who may be praying for vocations to the priesthood and to the religious life.

The Way of the Cross, also known as The Stations of the Cross, is a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. It grew from imitations of the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem, a traditional processional route representing the path Jesus walked from the house of Pontius Pilate to Golgotha, the place of Christ's crucifixion. In 2022, a dedicated group of 15 St. Charles parishioners worked for months to create a 45-minute tableau version video of the Way of the Cross. When first uploaded to our YouTube channel, it received over 600 views. Video will be available again from Ash Wednesday (Feb 14) until Easter
