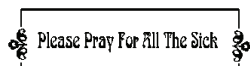


Our next executive meeting will be on Thursday Feb 3 at 7pm and the general meeting on Thursday Feb 20th.

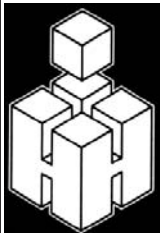
