From the Pastor's desk

Lent Begins

To me it seems like we just nicely celebrated Christmas and now, already, we stand on the threshold of Lent. For the next forty days we are invited to journey with the Church toward Holy Week and the time when we remember the passion, death and resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ. The passion, death and resurrection of Christ have been remembered and retraced by the followers of Christ since their inception in history. Lent is a time to look at our personal lives as well as our communal life and determine whether or not we are living according to the Gospels, especially in relation to our brothers and sisters who are poor. Ash Wednesday begins our Lenten journey. Masses are at 9 am and 7 pm with the distribution of ashes at each. During Lent we are invited to make sacrifices, especially financial ones. The collection on Ash Wednesday goes toward the Sisters of Mother Teresa and their work among the poor. Each Friday during Lent we will have the Stations of the Cross at 7 pm. As in the past, the Stations are led by various parish groups. We are invited to make the Stations of the Cross a form of sacrifice and penance during Lent. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the two days baptized Catholics in Canada are obligated to fast and abstain from eating meat. This is the fifth precept of the Church. The law of abstinence from meat binds those who are 14 years of age and older; the law of fasting binds those from the age of 18 to the end of the 59th year.

Birthday Blessings

Those having birthdays each month may receive a blessing on the first weekend of each month. The blessing will take place at the end of the Mass.

Vocational Discernment Group for Young Women

We have had a vocational discernment group for young men for many years here at St. Anthony's Parish, but never a group for young women who may be thinking about a religious vocation. I would certainly like to start such a group if there is interest in the parish. **There are now candidate who have expressed interest!** If any young woman has an interest in religious life, please let Fr. Thanksgiving & Blessing for the Alcartado Family

8th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introduction: Today's readings urge us to draw life from hearts filled with the goodness and teachings of the Lord ... to live virtuous lives that bear sound fruit. This week, we may desire to pray for a discerning heart and spirit, committed to trying to find God's invitation and his will in the actions and fruits of our daily life.

Sirach 27:4-7 In the first reading, the author uses images from everyday experience to highlight the importance of our words, suggesting that our moral worth (or the lack of it) can be proved by our speech.

1 Corinthians 15:54-58 In the second reading, Paul encourages the Christians in Corinth to see Christ's resurrection as the source of their hope. He also exhorts his hearers to persevere in doing good and working for the Lord.

Luke 6:39-45 In the Gospel, Jesus also uses simple reflections on human experience in his teachings. Disciples must learn from their master, and in the process become like him. Having warned against the danger of judging others, he also states that just as a tree's value is judged by its fruit, so the true test of human virtue is the way we live our life.

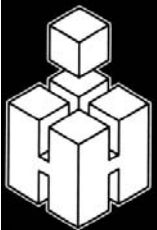
