Receiving the Sacraments of Marriage, Baptism, First Communion & Confirmation

Here at St. Anthony's we have more than sufficient parishioners who receive these sacraments. We don't need to look for additional seekers. Should you not be a parishioner, that is a registered parishioner who contributes with their weekend Mass attendance and to the financial needs of this parish, then you would be advised to seek these sacraments in the parish where you are registered and contributing. This includes those who may have been married at St. Anthony's but haven't darkened the doorway since; well, maybe at Christmas & Easter. Some seem to think that if they fill-out the registration form and do nothing further, that they are parishioners. Wouldn't that be convenient! In cases where someone is not attending and contributing in any parish, if they register here, then there is a waiting period, at least six months, prior to the sacraments. During this period, the expectations are weekend Mass attendance at St. Anthony's and financial support of the parish. In other words, we want members of the parish and not "buffet takers".

The Freemasons

Every so often I hear about a Catholic man who has joined the Freemasons. I think that most men who join this organization see it as little more than a social club and are unaware what the Church's stand is on the Freemasons. After all, many of these organizations do charitable work such as finance children hospitals or give wheelchairs to people who would otherwise not be able to afford them. However the Masonic associations, even the Shriners, "embrace principles which are irreconcilable with the doctrine of the Catholic Church and therefore membership in them is forbidden". The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith tells us that "any Catholic who enrols in Masonic associations are in a state of grave sin and may not receive Holy Communion. Historically, one of the primary objectives of the Freemasons has been the destruction of the Catholic Church. It is a naturalistic religion that contradicts orthodox Christianity". (Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith) Catholic men who would like to join an organization which does charitable work would be wise to join the Knights of Columbus. The Freemasons have a long history dating back to the time Pope Clement XII in1738.

The materials have been prepared by the Christian churches in Malta and Gozo. On February 10th many Christians in Malta celebrate the Feast of the Shipwreck of Saint Paul, marking and giving thanks for the arrival of Christian faith on these islands. The reading from the Acts of the Apostles used for the feast is the text chosen for this year's Week of Prayer. Here in Winnipeg the 2020 Week of Prayer will be marked by a City-wide Ecumenical Worship Service at 7:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 19, 2020 at Epiphany Lutheran Church, 200 Dalhousie Drive. 


Happy New Year to all Brother Knights, Family, and Friends! K of C dues envelopes are available at the back of the church. For anyone who hasn't


