Sanctuary Floor

Some of you may have noticed the new flooring piled in the corner of the church over the Christmas holidays. This coming Monday we will need some people to help us tear-out the old carpet in preparation for the installation of the new flooring. Adoration Chapel

This past Tuesday we began our adoration time in our "would be" chapel. At present we have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 10 am to 5 pm. Hopefully as time goes on we will be able to expand the hours. Once the sanctuary floor is complete we will begin the adoration chapel renovation. If you would like to sign-up for an hour of adoration, please do so. You do not have to come every day or even every week. We spend time with Jesus asking Him to stir young men's hearts to respond to the call to follow Him as a priest and young women to follow as Sisters. Those passing through the adoration area are asked to keep our traditional Catholic practice of **genuflecting** as you pass the monstrance. During the last few days I noticed a number of parishioners going about their duties in the gathering area as if Jesus wasn't there. If you are too busy to kneel and pray an Our Father or a Glory Be, then at least have enough respect to genuflect as you hurry on your way.

<u>Summer Job Programs & Freedom of Religion no longer mix!</u>

I'm wondering how many parishioners happened to read the article entitled Uncharitable Change on the "Faith" page of the Winnipeg Free Press on Saturday, 30 Dec. 2017. The article written by John Longhurst, basically reported changes which the Liberal government made regarding funding to non-profit groups and businesses. Any of these groups who wish to receive federal funding for summer job positions must attest that they support abortion, among other things. If they don't, then no funding. So much for freedom of religion! A political strategist Jack Fonseca referred to this government move as an "anti-Christian bias". He said that "this is a jawdropping act of discrimination against faith-based employers and non-profits and that it signals a special contempt for Christians." This is one in an ever escalating fleet of government moves to silence the Church. It is a slippery slope. Next on the agenda will be to remove the charitable status afforded to the Church and Christian non-profit organizations. Since all of our Church funding comes from those in the pews, this will have a profound effect on charitable giving. No longer will money, given to the Church, be considered as charitable in status and therefore no receipt which can be used for income tax purposes, be issued. I can see this happening, perhaps in the not-too-distant future, given the political climate rampant in Canada.


