All good Catholics know that January 1 is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. #### The Freemasons

Every so often I hear about a Catholic man who has joined the Freemasons. I think that most men who join this organization see it as little more than a social club and are unaware what the Church's stand is on the Freemasons. After all, many of these organizations do charitable work such as finance children hospitals or give wheelchairs to people who would otherwise not be able to afford them. However the Masonic associations, even the Shriners, "embrace principles which are irreconcilable with the doctrine of the Catholic Church and therefore membership in them is forbidden". The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith tells us that "any Catholic who enrols in Masonic associations are in a state of grave sin and may not receive Holy Communion. Historically, one of the primary objectives of the Freemasons has been the destruction of the Catholic Church. It is a naturalistic religion that contradicts orthodox Christianity". (Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith) Catholic men who would like to join an organization which does charitable work would be wise to join the Knights of Columbus. 


