From the Pastor's desk

Taking a Break!

With Oliver now being Father Oliver, I feel confident in leaving the parish in his capable hands while I take a holiday for a few days. Should anyone require spiritual assistance Father Oliver will help you. I will return prior to June 23 as I have a wedding rehearsal that day followed by the wedding the next morning.

What a Difference a Father Makes (taken in part from an article written by Gerald Korson.)

The family is under attack in today's culture. Not surprisingly, the forces that seek to undermine traditional family values take particular aim at fathers. It's not just the culture's doing, with its easy acceptance of broken families, same-sex "marriage", surrogate motherhood and a woman's legal right to abortion. Certainly, such trends tell fathers that "it doesn't matter if you're there or not." According to Thomas Wurtz, "we've done that to ourselves as men, as many men have become workaholics, addicted to sports, if not pornography, and succumb to other distractions that take them away from spending time with their children. Even when they are home, dads can thereby disengage from their families to the point that they become virtually absent fathers.

When fathers are not present or abdicate their roles, it's a crisis for both the Church and wider society. Fathers are providers, protectors and spiritual leaders in their family. In that role, a father must emulate the very fatherhood of God to his children. That image takes the form of unconditional love. "This is a great and deep longing of every human heart--to be loved, to be known, to be seen, to be chosen." according to Sister Maria Stella of the Sisters of Life. "God places this love in our hearts, and he brings it to life in our earthly fathers. And this is what allows a child to flourish."

God grants men the authority to form their children in faith. When men abdicate that responsibility, it leaves their children fatherless. This robs children of one of the most significant influences in their life. Being a responsible Christian father means getting up in the morning and spending time reading God's word. It means humbly serving one's wife and loving her like Ephesians 5 tells us, "as Christ loves his Church." It means thinking of yourself less often. It's thinking I'm a child of God. I'm called to be a saint and this means Christ-like leadership--spending time at home every day, leading the family in prayer, working hard to provide and taking the family to Mass every Sunday. The future of your children depends on who you are in the home today. If your kids see you going to confession every month and leading them in prayer at home, then they will know a father's godly leadership.

Gifts for the newly ordained:

People are asking what a suitable gift is for the newly ordained Father Oliver. I very well remember my own ordination and many of the gifts which I received: Bibles (some were Protestant Bibles, like the King James version) rosaries, scads of Holy Pictures and other religious paraphernalia. I guess some people thought that I went through all those years in the seminary without a Bible and a rosary! An ordination card with an enclosure of the amount that you would have spent on the purchase of a Bible, rosary, etc. will be put to much better use by the newly ordained. He can use that gift for whatever he needs or wants. Most of those gifts which I mentioned, I eventually gave to someone in need or to the Sisters of Mother Teresa to be given to the poor.

Once again, Chalice has been given an A rating from Charity Intelligence for the year of 2022, according to both Macleans and MoneySense magazines. Chalice supports children experiencing poverty. In this way, the Church responds to Jesus' exhortation to feed, educate, shelter and clothe the vulnerable. Chalice works out of its office in Bedford, Nova Scotia. As a parish, we fully endorse and support Chalice.
