#### Mass Attendance during COVID

The Manitoba Government now permits gatherings of 50 people. This includes places of worship such as our parish. We have in the neighbourhood of 1,000 families here in St. Anthony's Parish. At weekday Masses there is less a problem of accommodating those who ask to attend; however weekend Masses offer a challenge. Hopefully, if Manitoba continues being free of any new corona cases the government will increase the number allowed to attend public gatherings. In the interlude however, we would ask that those who have already attended a Sunday Masse allow others to attend Mass. The Archbishop has extended the dispensation from attending Sunday Masses until 6 September. Thank you for your cooperation.


