#### 2017 Abortion Statistics

As a lover of horses, I was disgusted to read how the animals are treated. At the same time, shouldn't there be a lot more protesting against the killing of human life in the womb? If we become so upset and agitated regarding the inhumane treatment of horses (as we rightfully should), then should we not become more agitated and upset about the killing of human life in the womb and the horrific methods used to accomplish the death of the child?.


