2017 Abortion Statistics

The Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) recently released the abortion statistics for Canada for the year 2017. An appalling 94,030 babies' lives were terminated in the womb in 2017. Many of these abortions are late term and involve the use of suction and sharp instruments. The baby tries to move away from the instruments. At about the same time as I read the above statistics in The Interim, I also read a piece in the Winnipeg Free Press about the inhumane treatment of horses which are being shipped from Canada to countries like China where their meat is in high demand. The treatment of the horses is inhumane because they travel for hours and hours without water or food and in crowded vehicles and planes. As a lover of horses, I was disgusted to read how the animals are treated. At the same time, shouldn't there be a lot more protesting against the killing of human life in the womb? If we become so upset and agitated regarding the inhumane treatment of horses (as we rightfully should), then should we not become more agitated and upset about the killing of human life in the womb and the horrific methods used to accomplish the death of the child?

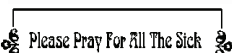

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP applications are being accepted, until May 1st, by Knights of Columbus, Supreme. Several funds provide support (e.g., \$1,500 renewable yearly) to students entering Catholic Colleges/Universities. Normally, knights and family members are eligible to apply. For more information, including eligibility and applications, please word search : 'scholarships K of C' then, select "Scholarships | Knights of Columbus" from the list.

VOCATIONS SCHOLARSHIPS are also available, primarily but not exclusively, for knights or their sons to study at a school of theology. They are valued at \$2,500 per year over 4 years. Though completed applications are due June 1st, candidates should review the eligibility criteria and application process soon; at word search 'vocations scholarship kofc'.

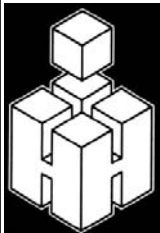
