Live Streaming of Sunday Masses

Although I had the very best in experts who volunteered to set-up so that we could live-stream my Masses, I decided against it. I thought that parishioners always hear and see me and this gives people an opportunity to tune-in to St. Mary's Cathedral and watch and listen to our Archbishop Richard Gagnon. I encourage folks to do just that on Sunday mornings. Keep in mind that the church front doors are open on Sunday morning from 9 am to 12 noon with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament during those hours. If someone wants to spend ten or fifteen minutes in the presence of the Lord and then go home and tune-in to the Archdiocese for Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral, they are certainly able to do both. I am also available for confessions most of the time. Just come to the office and ask. On Sunday I sit toward the entrance of the church in order to monitor those coming in and leaving. This way I can make certain that we keep the number of people in the church to not more than ten. So, if you want to attend confession on Sunday morning, simply ask me.

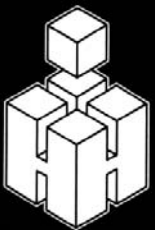
