From the Pastor's desk:

Safe & Respectful Environment

From time to time it's informative to be reminded that in the Archdiocese of Winnipeg we are committed to a safe and respectful environment. No one should be subjected to discrimination because of racial background, culture, ethnicity, heritage or sexual orientation. No one has the right to bully, show disrespect, harass or threaten anyone on church property. Harassment is defined as any objectionable or offensive conduct, comment, action, gesture or display, directed at a person or a group of persons that degrades, demeans, humiliates or embarrasses them. Bullying is abusive when the behaviour or rhetoric causes someone to feel threatened or humiliated. When we become a parishioner here at St. Anthony of Padua Parish we become a part of the one body of Christ. Regardless of how long we have been a member here, we have no more rights than the brother or sister who has just recently joined. Whatever gifts we contribute to the parish in terms of our time, talent and treasure are relinquished the moment that we give them. We no longer exert any ownership over them. It is also prudent to be respectful in the rhetoric and voice tone which we use; thus it is never a question of "us" and "them". In the Church our strength is in our diversity, although we are one body.

Winnipeg Harvest



Hebrews 7:24-28 In the second reading, we are told that Jesus has entered the heavenly sanctuary. His sacrifice has taken away the sins of all. When he comes in glory, he will bring salvation to those who eagerly await him.

Mark 12:38-44 In the Gospel, Jesus contrasts the behavior and attitudes of some arrogant and ostentatious scribes to that of a poor widow.

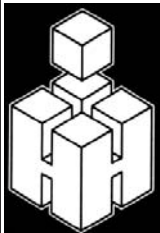
