From the Pastor's desk

Parking for Weekday Mass for the next few weeks

For mass Monday – Friday - Please avoid parking in the first row close to Aikins St. Start at the row with the Hydro Pole. They will be working on Aikins St and want to try and avoid damaging cars. (accidents happen!)

The month of November is upon us and during this month we Catholics remember those who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith. The Catechism of the Catholic Church beautifully reminds us of our current place as pilgrims, members of the Church, united in prayer with the saints and those undergoing purification. The Catechism states: "But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is.' All of us, however, in varying degrees and in different ways share in the same charity towards God and our neighbors, and we all sing the one hymn of glory to our God. All, indeed, who are of Christ and who have his Spirit form one Church and in Christ cleave together" (954). The Catechism goes on to describe "an exchange of spiritual goods" (955) that exists between those who have already entered into eternal life and us pilgrims on earth. It is a profound mystery of love that God allows our sacrifices and acts of mercy to have an effect on those souls being purified. Masses offered for the dead, Chaplets of Divine Mercy, rosaries, visits and prayers at graves, all make up part of the loving exchange of spiritual goods. The Archdiocese has published a brochure entitled [Why Catholic Cemeteries in Winnipeg](#). The brochure marks the Catholic cemeteries here in Winnipeg as places which proclaim the resurrection to eternal life and lasting memory. We are asked to support our Catholic cemeteries. More and more, influenced by secularization, people are opting for no funeral Mass, perhaps a grave side service or no tribute at all. Dedicated, practicing Catholics leave their burials to non-believing children who opt for the cheapest and most inconvenient means of finale closure. Remains are often scattered in the woods, thrown into a lake, or you name it! Faith-filled Catholics are encouraged to know their belief regarding death, purification and everlasting joy in the presence of God for committed followers of Christ. Document your Christian wishes for a funeral Mass, give a copy to the person whom you chose as executor of your will, explain to her/him what your wishes are while you are alive and well. This is particularly important when you select an executor who is a non-practicing Catholic. Many adult children and grandchildren may have some personal belief about death and life thereafter, but those beliefs are often not congruent with Christian beliefs. Many believe that "everyone is going to heaven", no matter what the person believed or how they lived their life in the here and now. That is not Catholic or even Christian belief. Everyone deserves to be remembered in death and every dedicated Catholic deserves a Christian funeral Mass

All Souls Indulgences

1. On All Souls Day (Nov. 2) a plenary (full) indulgence, applicable to the souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit any parish church and there recite one Our Father and one Credo.

2. On all the days from **Nov. 1-8**, a plenary (full) indulgence, applicable to the souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed.

Conditions for both indulgences:

- Only one plenary indulgence can be granted per day.
- It is necessary to be in the state of grace.
- Freedom from the attachment to (particular) sin, even venial sin, is necessary; otherwise the indulgence is only partial.
- Holy Communion must be received each time the indulgence is sought.
- Prayers must be recited for the intentions of the Holy Father on each day the indulgence is sought. (any prayers)
- A sacramental confession must be made within a week of completion of the prescribed work. (One confession made during the week, with the intention of gaining all the indulgences, suffices.)
