From the Pastor's desk:

Mass Intentions

Every once and awhile I like to place a blurb in the bulletin regarding Mass Intentions. On Sunday, we priests, according to canon law, must offer one Mass for the people. Since we have two Masses on Sunday, we alternate which Mass will be for the people. So, one Sunday the Mass for the people will be at the 9 am Mass and the next Sunday the Mass for the people will be at the 11 am Mass. Often people give envelopes with Mass intentions to either an usher or myself and the specific intention is for the Mass of that day which is designated for the people. If the Mass is for a deceased person, the best that I can do is to mention her/his name during the Eucharistic Prayer. Please give the required amount, which is clearly printed on the Mass intention envelope, for the Mass intention. However, if money is a challenge, then no problem, the priest will offer your Mass intention anyway. We don't "buy a Mass" and we don't "sell a Mass". The priest only receives one Mass stipend/day. The rest is sent, at the end of the year, to the Archdiocese. These Mass stipends are then distributed to poor parishes in rural areas. I personally benefited from these stipends when I was a pastor in the north. Let us continue to pray for one-another and especially for our deceased.

Sharing God's Gifts/Parish Assessment

We are nearing the end of the year and we still have approximately \$29,000 to collect in order to reach the target set for us by the Archdiocese. Many parishioners have joined me in generously contributing to the needs of the Archdiocese and for this I am grateful. The finances are used for: vocations, social justice, youth, catechism, adult lay formation, the priests' pension fund and home missions. Good followers of Jesus follow the Biblical standard of giving back to God 10% of what God has given to them. The 10% is broken down in the following manner: your parish 5%, 2.5% to the diocese, and 2.5% to other forms of charity, like heart & stroke, diabetes society. Aid to the Church in Need, Chalice, Save A Family Plan, etc. This leaves us 90% for our own personal usage. There are all sorts of reasons which we can devise to rationalize not assisting with Sharing God's Gifts/Parish Assessment. One reason is "the Church is rich, just look at the Vatican". None of this money goes to the Vatican. Another reason is "our parish has lots of money". If, for example, we ever decide to build another hall with a functional kitchen and catechsim rooms, it will take a whole lot more money than we presently have. Yet another reason is "I send money to charities in other countries". This is good and falls in the "other 2.5% charities". However. first comes your parish and the diocese to which you and I belong. I am not asking you for something that I do not contribute towards. I also contribute to Sharing God's Gifts and our Parish Assessment. There are some who make more than a comfortable salary and yet contribute very little to either the parish or the diocese. We are to contribute according to our income. So, more is expected from the person who earns \$100,000/year than from the person who earns \$50,000/year. Are you thankful to God for all that He has given to you? Do you want God to bless you even more financially? Then give sacrificially to God and He will do what He has promised. We can never outdo God in generosity! So hurry up, and get that \$ into the collection basket all your grateful people!!!




