When we become a parishioner here at St. Anthony of Padua Parish we become a part of the one body of Christ. Regardless of how long we have been a member here, we have no more rights than the brother or sister who has just recently joined. Whatever gifts we contribute to the parish in terms of our time, talent and treasure are relinquished the moment that we give them. We no longer exert any ownership over them. It is also prudent to be respectful in the rhetoric and voice tone which we use; thus it is never a question of "us" and "them". In the Church our strength is in our diversity, although we are one body.




