Development & Peace--Share Lent 2018

Some of you will remember that the Share Lent collection last spring was withheld by some of the Canadian bishops. including our bishop, due to conflicts with the Church's moral teachings on the part of some of the Development & Peace partners. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has noted that such local development partners must be in good moral standing with the Church before any of the Share Lent collection would be released. At the fall Plenary for the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops the guestion of reforming the process of choosing partners was discussed at length. The results of these discussions indicate that a hopeful road towards reform has now been embarked upon. Archbishop Gagnon is now satisfied that a positive direction is now being developed by D&P and has therefore released the Share Lent 2018 collection. I posted Archbishop Gagnon's letter regarding this on the bulletin board if anyone wants to read the entire letter which he e-mailed to each parish in the Archdiocese.




