Couples For Christ & Mass Attendance

It has come to my attention on several occasions that parishioners involved with Couples For Christ are missing weekend Masses in their respective parishes due to some function of CFC. Also some children enrolled in catechism here are being absented from catechism classes due to CFC. This is not acceptable. Being a member of CFC is helpful in one's faith development because it promotes family values and gives good, sound Catholic teaching. However, involvement in CFC should not supersede one's duty and involvement in one's parish. Members of CFC are to make attendance at weekend Eucharist in their own parish a priority. Those enrolled in catechism are not excused because their parents are involved in CFC. There is always order in the household of God. The evil one is all about confusion. Those children who are enrolled in catechism for the sacramental years like First Holy Communion will be welcome to participate in classes the following year should they miss classes this year due to CFC involvement.

November-we remember the dead

The Holy Souls are those "who die in God's grace and friendship" but who are still imperfectly purified. After death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. Part of the joy of belonging to the Catholic Church is the privilege of helping the Holy Souls to enter heaven. The early Fathers of the Church encouraged the practice of praying for the dead. They believed that this practice was inherited from the apostles. Tertullian (AD 160-240) wrote about the anniversary Mass for the dead, advising widows to pray for their husbands. St. Augustine remarked that he used to pray for his deceased mother Monica, remembering her request. Before she died she told him "When I die, bury me anywhere you like, but remember to pray for me at the altar." The words "trinity" and "incarnation" are not in the Scriptures either, but those doctrines are clearly taught. Likewise, Scripture teaches that purgatory exists, even if it doesn't use that word. According to Rev. 21:27 "*nothing unclean shall enter heaven*". Proverbs 24:16 also tells us that "*the just sin seven times a day*." Since it would be contrary to the mercy of God to punish such souls in hell, they are seen as entering a place or state of purification, which we refer to as "purgatory", which combines the justice of God with His mercy. We refer to this every time when we recite the Creed "*and I believe in the communion of saints*". The saints and those in purgatory, pray for us, and we pray both to the saints in heaven and for those in purgatory, that they may swiftly enter the Beatific Vision. Thus, death is no barrier to prayerful communion with the dead. We lovingly remember them and thank God for their eternal reward. Thus we offer Masses for the deceased because the Eucharist is the highest form of prayer that we can offer. All the Saints and angels, although we cannot see them, join us when we offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We can offer indulgences for those in purgatory. I have posted the indulgences in the gathering area and mentioned them at Mass on All Souls Day. Indulgences are an extension of what Jesus said to the apostles in the Gospel of John 20: 23 "*If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained*." By this the Church has the authority to both bind and retain sins. The Church in our catechism commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance be undertaken on behalf of the dead. CCC 1032

All Souls Indulgences

1. On All Souls Day (Nov. 2) a plenary (full) indulgence, applicable to the souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit any parish church and there recite one Our Father and one Credo.
2. On all the days from Nov. 1-8, a plenary (full) indulgence, applicable to the souls in purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray for the departed.

Conditions for both indulgences:

- Only one plenary indulgence can be granted per day.
- It is necessary to be in the state of grace.
- Freedom from the attachment to (particular) sin, even venial sin, is necessary; otherwise the indulgence is only partial.
- Holy Communion must be received each time the indulgence is sought.
- Prayers must be recited for the intentions of the Holy Father on each day the indulgence is sought. (any prayers)
- A sacramental confession must be made within a week of completion of the prescribed work. (One confession made during the week, with the intention of gaining all the indulgences, suffices.)

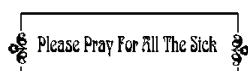
Winnipeg Harvest

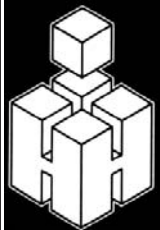
