The Discernment Group consists of approximately twelve young men who meet every month. The young men may not all advance to become priests, but it is certainly our hope and prayer that some will. The primary goal of the group is to build their relationship with God, the Church and one another, so that, no matter what vocation they may choose, they may be more rooted in their Catholic faith. We begin our time together with Eucharistic Adoration, followed by pizza. We then have a talk on a particular subject like: prayer, stewardship, confession, purity or other relevant topics. Sometimes we have a guest, such as another priest or lay person who speaks on a given subject. Other times we watch a video, followed by a discussion. We end the evening in the church with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. We also attend events in the Archdiocese such as Pro-life suppers, Chrism Mass, ordinations or the annual Serra supper. We have sponsored four of the members who attended at Come & See weekend at St. Joseph's Seminary in Edmonton. This gave them the opportunity to be with the seminarians and experience life in the seminary first hand. Twice we made a road trip to Saskatoon where we visited and had a meal with the Ukrainian Sisters of St. Joseph. toured their facility, packed with Nativity scenes, their icon shop and beautiful, ornate chapel dedicated to their two martyrs, Sister Olympia and Laurentia. This gave us the opportunity to venerate their relics. We stayed overnight at the Benedictine Monastery in Munster, SK. There are many who pray and sacrifice for these young men, in particular those who attend Eucharistic adoration in the Adoration Chapel. We are grateful for their intercessory prayers, as well as any others who may be praying for vocations to the priesthood and to the religious life. Fr. Oliver Omega was a member of the Discernment Group and we also have on in his second year in the permanent diaconate program. Ed Ploszay and his wife Mary We also had a vocational discernment group for girls. There were three in that group. One became a lay missionary in New Brunswick, one, Abby Pyrz is presently in the novitiate of the Franciscan Sisters of the Renewal in New York and the third continues to discern. Three more girls have expressed a sincere desire to become a member of this discernment group. At present, distance, transportation and other commitments impede our gathering. It will occur, hopefully in the near future.
