From the Pastor's desk:

October: pray the rosary & prayer to St. Michael

October is traditionally the month when we pray the rosary in a more dedicated fashion. This year the Holy Father, Pope Francis, has invited all the faithful, around the world, to pray the rosary and the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel daily. The Holy Father wants all to join in communion and in penitence. as the people of God, in asking Mary and St. Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other. The Pope cites the Book of Job in stating that the weapon against the Great Accuser, the devil "who goes around the world seeking to accuse". Only prayer can defeat Satan. With this request for intercession the Holy Father asks the faithful of all the world to pray that the Holy Mother of God place the Church beneath her protective mantle to preserve her from the attacks of the devil, the great accuser, and at the same time to make her more aware of the faults, the errors and the abuses committed in the past. The Pope asks that the rosary be concluded with the recitation of the prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel, written by Pope Leo XIII. Many bishops have already encouraged that the St. Michael prayer be prayed after Mass as we already do here at St. Anthony's.




