The Book of Job in states that the weapon against the Great Accuser, the devil "who goes around the world seeking to accuse". Only prayer can defeat Satan. We pray that the Holy Mother of God will place the Church beneath her protective mantle to preserve her from the attacks of the devil, the great accuser, and at the same time to make her more aware of the faults, the errors and the abuses committed in the past. The rosary should be concluded with the recitation of the prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel, written by Pope Leo XIII. Many bishops have already encouraged that the St. Michael prayer be prayed after Mass as we already do here at St. Anthony's
