From the Pastor's desk:

Couples For Christ & Mass Attendance

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introduction: Today we come together to share a meal – a Eucharistic meal, under the steady gaze of the crucified and risen Jesus. We started this meal with the same words used by Bartimaeus as he called out to Jesus for healing: "Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy." We pray that, like Bartimaeus, we will be healed of our blindness, eager to joyfully follow Jesus to Jerusalem, and to recognize his face in the poor and suffering of the world.

Jeremiah 31:7-9 In the first reading, a prophet has good news for the people. God will bring them home from exile.

Hebrews 5:1-6 In the second reading, we hear that Jesus is our high priest. As God's Son, he had a special call. He is a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek.

Mark 10:46-52 In the Gospel, blind Bartimaeus receives his sight from Jesus. He becomes a disciple and follows Jesus on the way.


