

From the Pastor's desk:

October: pray the rosary & prayer to St. Michael

October is traditionally the month when we pray the rosary in a more dedicated fashion. This year the Holy Father, Pope Francis, has invited all the faithful, around the world, to pray the rosary and the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel daily. The Holy Father wants all to join in communion and in penitence, as the people of God, in asking Mary and St. Michael Archangel to protect the Church from the devil, who always seeks to separate us from God and from each other. The Pope cites the Book of Job in stating that the weapon against the Great Accuser, the devil "who goes around the world seeking to accuse". Only prayer can defeat Satan. With this request for intercession the Holy Father asks the faithful of all the world to pray that the Holy Mother of God place the Church beneath her protective mantle to preserve her from the attacks of the devil, the great accuser, and at the same time to make her more aware of the faults, the errors and the abuses committed in the past. The Pope asks that the rosary be concluded with the recitation of the prayer to Saint Michael the Archangel, written by Pope Leo XIII. Many bishops have already encouraged that the St. Michael prayer be prayed after Mass as we already do here at St. Anthony's.

Rosary Coast to Coast

Astute Catholics know that the Church is definitely under attack. Behind the attack is the enemy of our souls and our Christian faith. As I mentioned in this bulletin, the Holy Father has asked us to pray the rosary and the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel. In particular the plea to pray the rosary this Sunday, **October 7**, the Feast of the Holy Rosary and the prayer of St. Michael the Archangel. This prayer will be done coast to coast at the same time. For us, that time will be **3 pm.** I will open the church and anyone who would like to pray the aforementioned prayers together with me before the Blessed Sacrament is welcome and encouraged to join me. We need to storm heaven on behalf of the Church and its ministers.

October 2019 an Extraordinary Missionary Month

The Holy Father announced last year that, on the advice of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples, that next year October would be an Extraordinary Missionary Month with the aim of fostering an increased awareness of the *mission ad gentes* and taking up again with renewed fervour the missionary transformation of the Church's life and pastoral activity. Last year Canadian donations to the Pontifical Mission Societies totalled \$6,004,964. This amount was shared with our brothers and sisters in the Catholic Church in the developing world. This year the theme for Mission Month is With Youth, We Proclaim the Gospel to all! The collection on World Mission Sunday is remitted in its entirety to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. All the donations gathered within the churches around the world on that day, constitute the Universal Solidarity Fund for the poorest dioceses of the Church.

"Go! Make disciples of all nations." (Mt 28:19) These words – the imperative mission of Christ – call each baptized Catholic to action. The church has a lasting mission to perform in this world, a mission that is ever more apparent, and the need for it is ever more urgent. In fact, mission isn't something the Church does. It is what the Church is! This year, World Mission Sunday is on October 21. This is a worldwide collection for the missionary Church that offers emergency aid when disaster strikes, cares for refugees in war-torn countries, provides rural health clinics and transportation for Priests, catechists, religious and lay pastoral workers. 


