From the Pastor's desk:

Cremated Remains

More and more individuals are choosing to have their deceased family member cremated, probably due to cost. With this alternative comes some challenges. One of them is deferring the burial or entombment for a later date. Sometimes this is done because of the weather or because a relative from far away is coming on a certain date. However, often the burial/entombment does not take place and the urn ends up in a closet, in the garage or left in a funeral home. Funeral directors tell me that dozens of urns are never claimed. Another problem is dividing the remains with portions going to various family members. The question needs to be asked what will ultimately happen to those urns when the family member dies and their children don't want the urn or maybe never knew the deceased. Still, another problem today is that some funeral homes suggest that the ashes be made into jewellery. Again, the question, what will happen to that jewellery when Aunt So & So dies? Will anyone know that the piece of jewellery is actually Uncle So & So? Perhaps the remains will end up in a land fill. The Church does not provide any service for these situations. Cremated remains are best, either buried or entombed in a columbarium. This gives loved ones a place to visit and to pray for the deceased's soul. It could very well be that in a hundred years a distant family member may want to see where their family member is buried. If the cremated remains have been scattered on some lake or in the bush, then there is absolutely no place where a deceased person can be found and visited. As a Church, we always recommend internment of cremated remains. A representative from St. Gianna's Columbarium will be speaking briefly at our Masses on the Sept. 22 & 28.

Catechists

This past Tuesday all the catechists met for a preliminary meeting. It was encouraging to see all those who devotedly want to share their time and talents in teaching the Gospel with the children of our parish. Thank you to all the teachers and their helpers in advance. There is still the possibility for someone to coordinate the children's liturgy at the Sunday 11 am Mass. Anna Sanduliak gave up her position last spring. If anyone feels the Holy Spirit directing them to take up this important ministry, let us know at the office, otherwise, there won't be any children's liturgy this year.

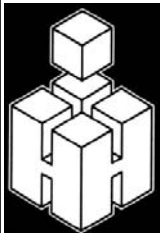
