On October 22, 2017, on the occasion of the 91st World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis called for an Extraordinary Missionary Month. In his message the Pope emphasizes that: "On 30 November 2019, we will celebrate the hundredth anniversary of the promulgation of the Apostolic Letter Maximum Illud, with which Pope Benedict XV sought to give new impetus to the missionary task of proclaiming the Gospel", thus responding to Jesus' perennial command to "go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature". Mk. 16:15 With this in mind, the words spoken by Jesus when he sent forth his disciples inspired the theme for the extraordinary missionary month: Baptized and sent: the Church of Christ on mission in the world. The Holy Father suggested this initiative with a double objective. On the one hand, the Pontiff wants "to foster an increased awareness of the mission to the nations and on the other hand "to take up again with renewed fervour the missionary transformation of the Church's life and pastoral activity." By virtue of our baptism we are each sent to evangelize those in our circle of family, friends and acquaintances. The world needs evangelizing now, perhaps more than ever before.


