FIFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

February 5th, 2012

Readings: Job 7:1-4, 6-7; 1 Cor. 9:16-19, 22-23; Mk. 1: 29-39



Job's lament about the miseries of human life could be our own, at least at times. He asks the unanswerable question: why the drudgery, monotony and suffering of life? Today's liturgy does not let us swell on this pessimistic note, for the psalm looks to the Lord who heals the broken-hearted. The gospel shows Jesus as the

great healer. In restoring people to wholeness he overcomes the powers of evil. But these healings are quickly followed by Jesus' prayer in solitude; he cannot restore to health unless he communes prayerfully with God. Nor will he limit himself to a narrow circle where he enjoys popularity. Healing is a sign of God's kingdom but it is not Jesus' main concern. No, he must preach the kingdom more widely. He wants faith, not astonishment at miracles. For Paul too, preaching is the centre of his ministry; indeed, God has chosen him for this duty. This servant of the gospel works with and for others in order to spread the Good News, which alone gives full meaning to our lives.



This past Tuesday, I travelled to London to speak with Bishop Fabbro on several pastoral issues. I was certainly grateful for his time and keen interest in Assumption Parish and we had a very good exchange on a variety of pastoral issues. I especially wanted to consult with him on a pastoral plan for the parish as we move forward anticipating the closing of Blessed Sacrament. I will be discussing this with the Pastoral Council at our meeting this week. The Bishop was very pleased to hear about our commitment not only to the spiritual needs of the west end but also the social needs as well. Hopefully by partnering even more with the St. Vincent de Paul, our schools, and neighborhood associations, we can continue not only to meet the demands but to expand our presence.

For the next several weeks, we will have guest organists who have applied for this position. Once the position is filled, we hope to look ahead towards the possibility of a parish choir. Again, I do want any parishioner who enjoys singing to think about joining a choir for the 11 am Mass. As I have said before, you do not have to have any training or choir background.....only desire and love of singingOlder children (say grade 8 and up) are encouraged as well.
