PRAYING THE ROSARY IN THE MONTH OF MARY

When COVID-19 was first spreading throughout the world, Pope Francis asked all Catholics to pray the Rosary with him for the intentions of those who have gotten sick or died from the virus, for all the front-line workers and researchers fighting it, and for all those affected. During May, the month of Mary, Fr. Peter and the Catholic Women's League invite our parish to pray the Rosary each day for these intentions, and we are hoping some of us might pray it in a very visible way.

We are blessed at St. Teresa's to have an outdoor Rosary Path. We would like to have one

family, or person, or household come to the

Rosary Path each day in May and pray the Rosary. You can walk the path as you pray, or sit on the bench, whatever posture works for you. If you would like to sign up for a date please email Alice Soeder at

alice_soeder@hotmail.com. You can go to the path to pray any time on your date, although during daylight hours would be safest and the best way to witness to our community that we are standing with them.

Not all of us are able to leave our homes right now, due to the weather and of course the threat of this virus. Please, if you are not able to go outside, continue to pray in solidarity with our community and our world. And if you go to the path to pray and find someone else already there, please stay 6 feet apart from others. Our prayers and physical distancing are working, so this May let our voices join together in supplication to our Mother!

MONTH OF MARY – The month of May is the "month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady," and it is the occasion for a "moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God's mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance" (Paul VI: Encyclical on the *Month of May*, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practised in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

The practice was granted a partial indulgence by Pius VII in 1815 and a plenary indulgence by Pius IX in 1859. With the complete revision of indulgences in 1966 and the decreased emphasis on specific indulgences, it no longer carries an indulgence; however it certainly falls within the category of the First General Grant of Indulgences. (A *partial indulgence* is granted to the faithful who, in the performance of their duties and in bearing the trials of life, raise their mind with humble confidence to God, adding — even if only mentally — some pious invocation. Excerpted from *Enchiridion of Indulgences*.
