
We welcome **Luke Emmanuel Pereira.** In the celebration of the Sacrament last Sunday, he received new life in Christ. We pray that, with

YEAR OF AMORIS LAETITIA FAMILY SPEAKER SERIES (On Zoom)

The Diocesan Speaker Series is the highlight of the Year of Amoris Laetitia Family. It will feature a monthly topic related to family from January through to June, held virtually on Zoom. The topic covered each month is open to all; you are welcome to join one particular evening, all the evenings, or any number that interest you. Family sets the foundation for faith and for the good of society, yet the strains of family life can sometimes leave many feeling stressed. As a result, we are seeing cracks in the very foundation of family. In Amoris Laetitia, Pope Francis writes: "The Synod process allowed for an examination of the situation of families in today's world, and thus for a broader vision and a renewed awareness of the importance of marriage and the family. The complexity of the issues that arose revealed the need for continued open discussion of a number of doctrinal, moral, spiritual, and pastoral questions (2)."

Our speaker series is designed to be educational and uplifting to provide support for each person on their journey. The series is a great opportunity to learn more about oneself, but, as importantly, to take part in and become familiar other members of the Diocesan family. The first set in the series is on *The Joys and Struggles of Family*, and has so far featured Auxiliary Bishop Wayne Lobsinger. OUR PARISH'S 75TH ANNIVERSARY YEAR!!! A THUMBNAIL HISTORY

Holy Rosary Parish was formed out of portions of the Cathedral Parish in Hamilton, St. John's. Burlington, and St. Thomas, Waterdown. Father Bernard Harrigan was the first Pastor, and the first Mass was celebrated on July 6, 1947 in the chapel of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Holy Rosary School was built in 1951. Under the leadership of Father Blake Ryan, a new church and rectory were built. The 400-seat Church was dedicated on May 1, 1955, by Bishop Joseph F. Ryan. In 1987, during the pastorate of Father Anthony Ciavarro, the Church was redesigned, with a 180-degree rotation. Beautiful stained glass, statuary, and sculpture adorn the renewed space. The Parish Centre was built in 1994, during the pastorate of Father Ron Cote. Pastors who have served the parish are: Msgr. Bernard Harrigan (1947-1953); Father Blake Ryan (1953-1964); Father Harold Smith (1964-1975); Father Carlo Bianchi (1975-1979); Father Anthony Ciavarro (1979-1989); Father Ron Cote (1989-2004); Father Frank Trzupek (2004-2011); Msgr. Murray Kroetsch (2011-2013); Msgr. Edward House (2013-2016); and Msgr. Martin Vallely (2016-present).
