
CWL REGIONAL MEETING HERE

TODAY IS THE DAY OF PRAYER FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ABUSE

Bishop Crosby has asked that the Second Sunday of Lent (today) be observed every year as a Day of Prayer for victims of sexual abuse. May this continuing shame and stain on church and society be removed by compassionate outreach to those who have suffered so much.

"Father, since your mercy has been revealed in the tenderness of your Son Jesus Christ, who said to his disciples, 'Let the little children come to me', we pray that your church may be a secure home, where all children and vulnerable adults may be brought closer to your beloved Son. May all those who have been abused by your ministers, whether physically, emotionally. or sexually, be respected accompanied by tangible gestures of justice and reparation, so that they may feel healed with the balm of your compassion."
