Holy Rosary was formed out of portions of the Cathedral parish in Hamilton, St. John's, Burlington and St. Thomas, Waterdown. Father Bernard Harrigan was the first Pastor and the first Mass was celebrated on June 6, 1947 in the chapel of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Holy Rosary School was built in 1951. Under the leadership of Father Blake Ryan (1953-1964) a new Church and rectory were built. The 400 seat church was dedicated on May 1, 1955. In 1987, during the pastorate of Father Anthony Ciavarro, the church was redesigned with a 180 degree rotation. Beautiful stained glass, statuary, and sculpture adorn the renewed space. Other pastors who served the parish were: Msgr. Bernard Harrigan, Father Blake Ryan, Father Harold Smith, Father Carlo Bianchi, Father Anthony Ciavarro, Father Ron Cote, Father Frank Trzupsek, Msgr. Murray Kroetsch, Msgr. Edward House and the present pastor, Father Martin Vallely. Today there are over 600 registered families.

YEAR OF MERCY PILGRIMAGE

Join our Parish Pilgrimage to the Cathedral Basilica of Christ the King, Hamilton. The Cathedral has been designated by Pope Francis as a Jubilee Church; and its Holy Door of Mercy was blessed by Bishop Crosby at the start of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. The pilgrimage is to be a time for us to reflect on God's mercy and pray for conversion. We will gather and enter through the Cathedral through the Holy Door. There will be time for personal prayer and reflection in front of the exposed Blessed Sacrament. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be celebrated at 3:00 p.m. Our pilgrimage will conclude with Mass at 4:00 p.m. and **Father Martin will be the homilist.**
