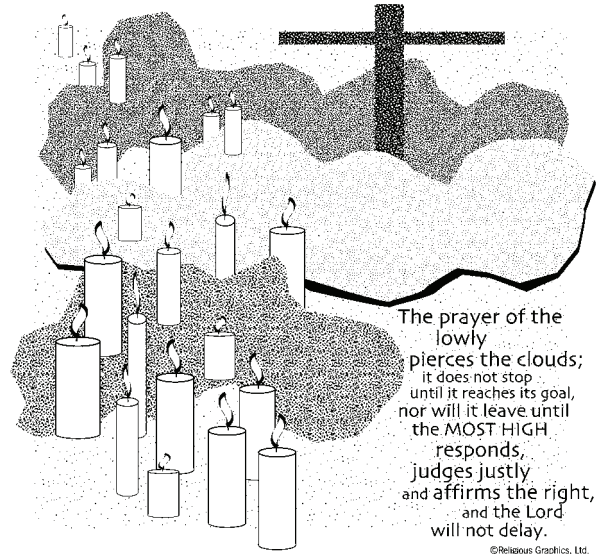
ANNIVERSARY ROSARIES AND PRAYER CARDS

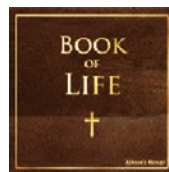
