

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

The parish community continues to benefit from your generosity in pledges made/fulfilled from the 2019 Capital Campaign. To date, more than 72% of the total pledged amount of \$ 493,381 has been fulfilled, with close to a year and a half left to fulfill most pledges. We anticipate ultimately obtaining some \$ 375,000 for our parish use. So far, we have pulled down \$ 100,000 from the Fund. Since our last report on progress with those funds (made to you in March), we have also:

- ---completed furnishing the Livestreaming capability;
- ---purchased a new portable video projector:
- ---obtained beautiful new Sanctuary appointments to replace the tired old ones (new bases for the Processional Cross and the Easter Candle; new altar and server candlesticks; new holy water pot and thurible (for the incense));
- ---started on plans for retrofitting the lighting in the church (chandeliers) with new, long-lasting LED lighting;
- ---started on installing a railing for easier access to the rectory office door (the Knights are a big help with this!);
- ---now are beginning to move on some necessary overhaul of the Parish Centre kitchen.

We are just beginning to put into motion the long overdue hiring of a Youth/Family Minister---not to mention discovering the need for some kind of "Media Manager" for the burgeoning parish digital footprint...maybe they will end up being the same person!

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY (EVANGELIZATION OF THE NATIONS)

Today is the Annual World Mission Sunday, in support of the Pontifical Mission Societies. We reflect on how all members of the believing community are missionaries, who have a role in spreading the Gospel message. Through prayer and personal sacrifices, we witness to our conviction that the task of caring for those in need is at the heart of what it means to be Church.

Funds raised help in some of the poorest areas of the world: to support and train mission priests, religious, and catechists; to establish and support health care clinics and schools; to assist in reconstructing churches which have been destroyed because of anti-Christian persecution, war, and natural disasters; and to contribute in many other ways.

Hamilton Diocese typically raises between \$ 75,000 and \$ 100,000 in this collection every year. Please be generous in your donation, today or in the next few weeks---especially given that the pandemic has prevented our parishes from receiving and supporting a visiting Missionary for the last two years.

SYNOD OF BISHOPS 2023---THE PROCESS HAS BEGUN!

The process for the next Synod of Bishops has begun, leading to the gathering in Rome in October 2023. The Theme of the Synod is: *For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission.* For the first time, the meeting will be the culmination of a "three-year path" involving all of the People of God at every level of the Church. This "path" is a process rather than an event.

The first phase (October 2021 to April 2022) has begun under the leadership of the Bishop in each Diocese. This stage is conceived as a broad consultation with the People of God in each Diocese. In the Diocese of Hamilton, a Committee has been established to guide the Diocesan Phase of the Synodal Process. As of press time, we still await the promised information to be sent to the Parishes, providing parishioners an opportunity to respond to the questions to be considered by the Synod.

Let us continue to pray for the fruitfulness of this synodal path, calling to mind Pope Francis' own words:

So let us experience this moment of encounter, listening and reflection as a season of grace in the joy of the Gospel, allow[ing] us the opportunity to become a listening Church, to stop and listen to the Spirit in adoration and prayer, to listen to our brothers and sisters speak of their hopes and of the crises of faith present in different parts of the world, of the need for a renewed pastoral life and of the signals we are receiving from those on the ground..... to beome a Church of closeness....not standing aloof from life, but immers[ing] herself in today's problems and needs, bandaging wounds and healing broken hearts with the balm of God.
