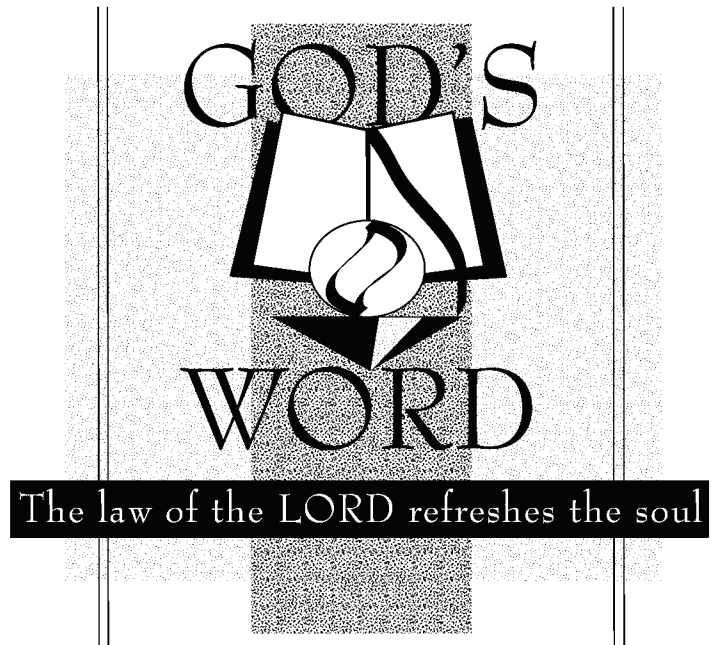
PLEASE PRAY.....
