Hockey tournaments were really the travel itinerary growing up. Play hockey and see Ontario, or at least parts of it. My first visit to Midland – hockey. My first visit to Tillsonburg- hockey; London – hockey; Buffalo – hockey. I think you get the pattern. The furthest north in the province I had ever been was north of Huntsville, though not because of hockey, but because we were considering moving north. One of my dad's dreams was to live on a lake with summer cottage rentals. We were scouting out a resort. The idea was that as teenagers, we could be fishing and hunting guides. Since I was a fan of neither hunting nor fishing, or any outdoor venue that can be plagued by blackflies or mosquitos, I was glad that dad's dream remained unfulfilled. It wasn't until university in Sudbury that I made it to northern Ontario, though once there, I learned that it was merely central Ontario as we classmates who were traveling from much more northerly towns. I think university was a great incubator for the real spirit of Advent. As Christmas exams rolled around, classes usually ended the first week of December. Then the slow exodus began. Some students left early because they didn't have exams. Then as each final exam happened, the residence became quieter and sparse. It was programs like mine whose exams lasted bitter end. As each friend departed for home, the longing and yearning to be done and move on intensified. Studying became more of a challenge as the expectations built up. The excitement of boarding that bus and heading home was palpable. It had been a couple of months since being home and this was the time before skype, and emails, and cell phones. Phone calls were restricted to weekends in the residence payphone, so there was a great anticipation for face to face contact. The local bus ride to the bus depot took almost as long as the bus ride home. The local milk run from Sudbury could be excruciating with stops at great destinations like Byng Inlet, and Pointe-au-Baril, and Britt. Once the bus crossed the district boundary at Port Severn I always felt like I was home even though it was another hour to Barrie and then half an hour to home. Stepping through the doors and being home, with the Christmas tree (always inadequately decorated to my exacting standards.) and our dog running circles with crazy excitement, it was perfection. I think Christmas day was anticlimactic compared to the arrival home. Not that Christmas was bad mind you, but what made



Christmas Christmas, was finally making it home. It was the fulfillment of the journey, and that is really the spirit of Advent, that long, excited anticipation and work to make it home, the dreams of re-uniting. Happy Advent.


### **CWG QUILT RAFFLE**
