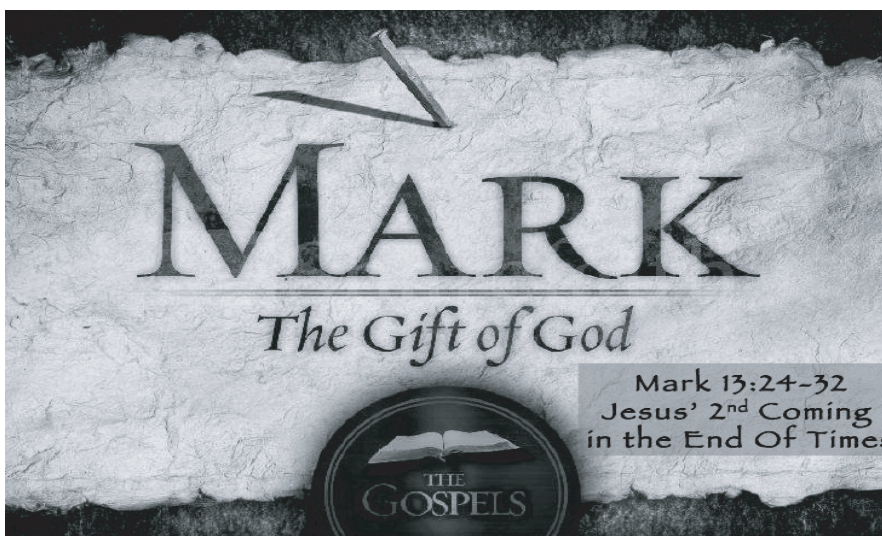

It was easier for babysitting if needed and it didn't screw up the whole weekend. An added bonus was that it was cheaper. They both didn't want a sit down dinner. The structures of these make it hard to mingle and mix. They can be very static. What they opted for was stand up tables with small plate fare with a myriad of delicious options for food. So everyone stood and or sat, there was no assigned seating. Of course the most popular seating area was where the Paul Henderson of the 1972 Summit Series fame was sitting. It was a wonderfully relaxed opportunity to get to meet all these strangers who are part of my brother's life. Having experienced so many various receptions, I have to confess that this was my favorite format. Although sit down dinners are nice and elegant, the informality and freedom of the 'fabulous finger food free for all' as we called it was, well, in a word, fantastic. A good time was had by all. And I guess it didn't hurt that it provided a great opportunity for people to mingle up to me and mention how much they enjoyed



my homily at the wedding – though it goes without saying... Well, I am excited that our New Year's Eve committee has opted for this format. it is so relaxing and free flowing, and the menu is outstanding. Hope to see you there bouncing from table to table.

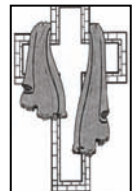
