

OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

A very special word of thanks to the *Catholic Women's League of Holy Cross Parish* who have placed a statue of **Our Lady of Guadalupe** in our parish church in commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the establishment of the League in our parish. Bishop Crosby blessed the image during the Anniversary Mass on November 30th.

The feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is **December 12th**. She is referred to as the Patroness of the Americas and the Star of the New Evangelization. Her story is a beautiful one.

She is standing with brilliant light surrounding her (Revelation 12.1). Her hands are clasped together in prayer - she joins her prayers with ours - she is, like us, a disciple. The image stands on an angel for she is greater than the angels. This posture of being carried was significant for the Aztec people as only kings and queens are carried in this manner.

The four petal sash at her waist, an Aztec symbol, indicates her virginity, but the swelling below the sash indicates that she is with Child.

The flower embroidered on the abdomen of her dress, where the heart of the baby would be, is a Quinconx, a flower that in Aztec culture indicates the Lord of the Universe.

The four embroidered flowers on the dress indicate a map of the mountains of the region where she appeared to *Saint Juan Diego*. The mantel is turquoise colour with gold trim ... the colours of royalty in Aztec culture.

The veil of stars is a map of the constellations of the sky on the very day of the apparition December 9, 1531 ... confirmed by modern day astronomers.

The cuffs of her dress are folded back as a sign of Jewish nobility. The angel is holding both the veil (heaven) and the dress (earth). The apparition is a message from heaven for the whole earth. Many conversions have been attributed to the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe.
