Reflection: The evangelist notes that "the doors were closed" to make the point that now Jesus has a different kind of existence. His earthly life was over. He now has a risen body. St. Paul qualifies the risen body as imperishable, powerful, glorious and spiritual as opposed to a perishable, weak, dishonorable and natural earthly body (cf. 1Cor 15:42-44). Apostle Thomas would not believe the testimony of his companions. Thomas said "Unless I see... I refuse to believe". He insisted on a personal experience. It appears to more of an insistence of love than an expression of disbelief on the part of Thomas. He was not willing to accept that Jesus could deprive him of that much -awaited experience. Besides, what he had insisted was to have a close experience of the holes made by the nails that pierced the hands of Jesus and the wound that created on his side by the lance. Thomas loved a suffering Christ.
