#2: 18th National March for Life

The National March for Life takes place Thursday, May 14, 2015, in Ottawa. This year's theme is "**When Faced with Hard Choices, LET LIFE WIN ✓.**" This yearly event for respect for life and family is one of the most important demonstrations held on Parliament Hill. Last year more than 25,000 people, 80% of which were youth or young workers, participated in the march throughout downtown Ottawa.

The March for Life provides an ideal opportunity for all Catholics to come together in support of life. More than 3½ million abortions have been performed in our country since May 14, 1969, when the Omnibus Bill was passed.

I invited all priests, deacons, and lay faithful, especially the youth and teachers to participate. Coach buses will be leaving throughout the Diocese, to reserve your seating, call: **Valley East** – Maurice Audette at 705-897-4429 **Sudbury** – Contact Thérèse St. Denis at 705-566-0707.

Return time is about 10 pm. The cost of the trip is \$20/person, students are FREE. If you are physically unable to participate in the march, you are encouraged to bring a lawn chair and enjoy the entertainment on the grounds in front of the Parliament buildings.

I take this opportunity to thank the organizers of this event, and to all Pro-Life workers in our diocese who, day after day, give witness to our behalf in the sacredness of life.
