COUNTDOWN TO LENT

There are two (2) Masses, on Ash Wednesday, scheduled at our church for 8:00 am and 12:05 pm (noon hour). Ash Wednesday is a universal day of fasting and abstinence from meat. Lent is a time for penance and repentance, for almsgiving and prayer, and for working to change our attitudes that may not be pleasing to God. Lent has two major purposes: 1) it recalls or prepares for baptism, and, 2) emphasizes a spirit of penance. Through forty days of closer attention to God's word and of more fervent prayer, believers are prepared to celebrate the Paschal Mystery (Ordo 2015; page 132).
