Canadian Catholic Bishops and Youth Journey to Panama to Participate in World Youth Day January 22nd to 27th, 2019

Ottawa – This weekend is the conclusion of the 2019 World Youth Day (WYD) which began on Tuesday January 22nd. Catholic youth and young adult pilgrims from around the world descended upon Panama City, Panama. Held every two to three years, World Youth Day is an international gathering of youth and young adults (15-30



years old) for a celebration of the Catholic faith. Numerous Bishops, priests, consecrated people, and lay faithful also take part in gathering to experience their common faith in Christ. It is estimated that some 500,000 people participated in this year's event with an emphasis on prayer, spiritual formation, and cultural exchange. Canada was represented in Panama by a strong delegation of more than 1,000 pilgrims representing over 20 dioceses, religious institutes, and ecclesial movements from across the country. In addition, nine Bishops from Canada will attend WYD to accompany the pilgrims during the encounter.
