A Saint's Corner

Blessed Bishop Mykola Charnetsky, in solidarity with our Ukrainian friends and neighbors. As always in and after wars the Church suffers in many ways, the *Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church* was driven underground by the relentless persecution of the Soviet Union under Stalin, even became the largest "illegal" Christian community in the world.

It survived against all odds because of individuals, laity and clergy, like Bishop Charnetsky. Born in the Western Ukraine, ordained in 1909 and consecrated as bishop in 1931; in 1945 he was arrested as a "Vatican agent" and sentenced to hard labour in

Siberia, he was tortured and because he was close to death Bishop Charnetsky was released after eleven years. By the grace of God, he was able to witness for three more years before he died as a Martyr and was beatified in Lviv in 2001.
