What is Ordinary Time? After Easter, this may seem like a let down, but it's not. According to Dominick Albano, Ordinary Time isn't ordinary at all and is equally special to Advent and Easter. This season celebrates a very specific time in the life of our Lord, Jesus Christ. During the next weeks, we participate in the rest of Jesus earthly ministry and some of the major events of the Gospels that we know and love ... "the miracles, the parables, the calling of the twelve, the



sermon on the mount, the bread of life discourse" ... We get all that and more during this coming season! Truly, there is much to celebrate. Ordinary, in this context, comes from the Latin term *ordinalis*, meaning "numbered or ruled". This title simply refers to the rhythmical nature of the season. The liturgical colour is Green, representing a time of growth and expansion of the church following the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Green is a very natural color and is often a symbol for growth and new life. Like all liturgical seasons, Ordinary Time is meant to be lived! We aren't passive receptors of the liturgy – or at least we shouldn't be. We are called to be active participants! Participating in Ordinary Time means participating in the everyday life of Jesus.
