Front Steps Project Update ... As was detailed in last week's bulletin, the initial costs estimate of approximately \$300k is forecasted to be approximately double. We are taking a three pronged approach to get the project approved: 1) review site conditions, 2) simplify the design, and 3) fundraise.

As part of the investigations (step 1 above), we are recommending a two phased approach to construction with removals and investigation of existing foundation conditions this fall, then updating the design over the winter with construction of the new steps happening in the spring/summer.


