- Bids have exceeded expectations by almost double due to:
 - depth of excavation and uncertainty. The current design is based on total removal and replacement of the foundations down to base of footings (~ 12ft deep)
 - time of year which likely requires cold weather concreting
 - building materials escalation (Covid)

Currently, we have approximately \$12k that has been donated and earmarked for this project. We need in the range of \$600k.

We are taking a three pronged approach to this problem:

- 1) We will work on investigating site conditions and minimizing unknowns of the project to the extent possible. That is to say we are not sure about existing foundations and if they can be relied upon so we're going to try and investigate them.
- 2) We will rationalize the design to save money. We'll be using more basic trims, attempting to use less deep foundations and if necessary, change the design to reduce stairs from 3 to 2 (one on each side) or 1 (centre only).
- 3) Raise funds for the project

As part of the investigations (step 1 above), we are considering a two phased approach to construction with removals and investigation of existing foundation conditions this fall, then updating the design over the winter with construction of the new steps happening in the spring/summer.

We expect this to allow us:

- to determine costs more accurately/confidently and therefore the final design
- save money (and get better quality) on concreting that is done in better climate.

We need action from our parishioners:

- let us know if you have any concerns with the steps being removed (and staying removed for the winter)
- donate to the project ... Please mark donations 'Building fund front stairs'
- fundraising ideas and action

We'll communicate more as we get more details from the architect, engineer and contractors and also keep you apprised of the donations/fundraising.
