# The Friar's Nook

Advent is the gateway to the rest of the celebrations of the Christian liturgical year. It is a time of preparation for the birth of Christ. Its duration can vary from 21 to 28 days, since it is celebrated on the four Sundays before Christmas. It is a time of reflection, conversion and hope.

During Advent, a crown with green branches, called the Advents Crown (Adventskroenung in German as is known in my old country)), is placed in churches and also in some homes. It has four candles, one for each Sunday of Advent. There is a small Advent tradition: each of these four candles is assigned a virtue that must be improved during that week, for example: the first, love; the second, peace; the third, tolerance and the fourth, faith. FIRST WEEK: LOVE

It is time to love. Put aside your old grudges. Forget the harm that may have been done to you. God is love. If we want to be like Him, we must open our hearts to love and spread and give love.

Make your own personal examination of conscience: the Gospel of the first Sunday of Advent asks us to be attentive and vigilant. Attentive to the different circumstances that our fellow human beings are experiencing, especially those who are having the worst time, and to put love around us. Vigilant so that our hearts do not harden and we are not capable of loving, due to narrow-mindedness, selfishness or pride.

Love is a decision, not a feeling, and it is presented externally by actions. It is Advent, a time to love, a time to make the firm decision to express love to those we meet in these days of preparation for Christmas. In this way we will be able to fully celebrate the Incarnate Word who enables us to love.

<u>6 December - St. Nicholas' feast day</u> St Nicholas was the Bishop of Myra (in modern Turkey) in the fourth century and was present at the Council of Nicaea. He was imprisoned during the persecutions of Diocletian, but was released after Constantine became emperor. He is also known as St Nicholas of Bari (in Italy) because his relics are reposed there in the church of San Niccolo. St Nicholas is most well known as the beloved patron saint of children. His wealthy parents died in an epidemic while Nicholas was still young. Obeying Jesus' words to "sell what you own and give the money to the poor," (Matthew 19:21) Nicholas used his inheritance to assist the needy, the sick, and the suffering. His most well-known act of generosity involved leaving bags of gold coins in the stockings of three impoverished sisters.
