The Friar's Nook

There is nothing as dangerous to the mind and morals as lying, as denying the truth. Jesus warns us about an unforgivable sin: blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. What is this sin? Why can it not be forgiven? And what does it have to do with lying?

The context of this warning is this: Jesus had just cast out a demon. Some of those who witnessed it firmly believed that only someone sent by God could do such a thing. However, they hated Jesus. The fact that they saw him cast out a demon was an uncomfortable truth for them, so uncomfortable that they decided to deny what they had seen with their own eyes. Despite knowing that they were lying, they said that Jesus had cast out the demon with the power of Beelzebub, the prince of demons.

Jesus first tried to make them see their lie, but they insisted on their lie. It was in this context that Jesus gave this warning about a sin that cannot be forgiven because it blasphemes against the Holy Spirit. Those people denied the truth, knowing that they were lying. When we tell our first lie, we still know that we are lying, and that allows us to repent.

But if we continue to lie and deny the truth, we can reach a point where we believe our own lie. Then, what is false becomes truth to us, what is evil appears good, and what is dark appears light. At that point, sin becomes unforgivable, not because God refuses to forgive us, but because we no longer want that forgiveness, or even believe that we need it.

How is this blasphemy against the Holy Spirit? This happens when we live in unfaithfulness, idolatry, hatred, divisions, and dishonesty. When we lie, we deny reality and truth. In doing so, we turn away from the Spirit of God and despise Him, which is equivalent to blasphemy. The danger of lies in our world Satan is the prince of lies.

That's why one of the greatest dangers of our time is the amount of lies, misinformation and denial of reality that we see every day, especially when the truth is not comfortable for us. Denying reality destroys our soul, breaks up our communities, endangers the future of the planet and damages our mental health. Denying truth not only destroys its very meaning, but also our ability to live in peace with reality.

Beginning March 2, we will begin taking requests for booking of our Sanctuary Lamp here at St. Joan of Arc Parish.
