## The Friar's Nook

Last weekend, we celebrated Saint Valentine's Day here at the parish. We had an extraordinary dinner with a 17-piece brass ensemble playing big band music to dance to. It was a wonderful evening and we hope to do it again next year!

As we celebrate St. Valentine's Day, we are reminded of one important virtue – love, but in the Christian sense. It's not about infatuation or feelings, but rather, a love that does. How we act and how we treat others is an indicator of how we love. Now, who we love is made clear by Jesus when he says, "Love your neighbour as yourself." Recently, some people have tried to limit Christian love, or at least water it down. The Vice President of the United States misused a theological understanding of love recently in that he said, "We should love the people around us the most, then our neighbours next, then our community somewhat less." Basically, in his mind, love was something that had limits. Like ripples in a pond, it grows weaker as it travels further away. So other countries should take care of their "own people." This infuriated Pope Francis enough that he made a direct response, claiming it was an improper and misread use of the theological principle of love.

Pope Francis says, "God's love invites us to share with others, to respond generously to the needs of the poor, to encourage those who suffer, and to be already ready to forgive and to hope. Love is the very centre of the Gospel!" It should not be watered down or made to fit an ideology, but should be self-giving to all people. This especially strikes me here at St. Joan of Arc Parish when we say, "All Are Welcome." Welcoming others means offering the love of God to them – no matter who they are or what they do. It is never given in judgment but rather freely as Jesus gave it to us freely, right to the point of his own death.

Of course, sometimes this works the opposite way. Sometimes, it's easier to love those we don't live with or are not around us more than the people who are around us. I was talking to the Confirmation students this week and reminded them of that. As they enter their teenage years, there may be more struggles at home. All the more reason to love harder. The Gospels give us examples over and over again of how His disciples messed up and didn't understand what Jesus was saying and doing and yet he never stopped loving them. He is, for us, that example of what love truly is – love that we don't simply celebrate on St. Valentine's Day but the love we should celebrate each and every day especially when it's difficult to love. I encourage you to keep the love of the Lord in your hearts this year and let it show in you generously.
