From time to time, I'd like to share with you some prayers that I think you will find meaningful. As you probably know, the Friars had a retreat before our General Chapter and one of the things we were given is a treasury of prayers to reflect on in carry with us. This week I'd like to share with you the prayer of Thomas Merton.

My Lord God, I have no idea where I'm going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end, nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. *I* hope that we will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore, will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, from you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.

This prayer really speaks to me because it calls for humility. Nobody knows the mind of God hence we shouldn't try to but accept the fact that He is with us and that we should try to please Him by what we do and how we treat others. The thing about this prayer is that I think is important is that it keeps us from feeling alone. We are not alone in our unsurety as to God's will and our response to it. Everyone experiences that but, here's a wonderful way of putting it into perspective in our lives that we may know the peace He wishes for us and continue to trust in His presence.

I would like to conclude the reference to a card I got this week from some parishioners. I share this with you because it really is for all the parish not simply me. They were parishioners at Saint Sebastian's before it closed and had to find a new spiritual home. They have made their home with us because of the welcoming they received not simply by me but by all the parish! I can't begin to tell you how happy that makes me that what I see in our parish is recognized by others. And that your part in welcoming all people is working well.
